## **1. CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME**

The President welcomes the members of the Executive Board present and sets German as the working language.

## **2. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

The agenda is unanimously approved. The requested amendments to the agenda made before deadline by Vice President for Development Ubaldo Prucker and Vice President for Finance Dr. Günther Zwatz as well as Vice President for Information Ivor Lehotan have been considered.

## **3. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES V 62/05, 63/05 and V 64/05**

The President declares approval of the minutes V 62/05, 63/05 and 64/05. No written objections from members of the Executive Board were registered within the time limit. The list of attendance at the 63rd meeting, part 2 was corrected immediately on the advice of the Vice President Development.

## **4. INFORMATION / REPORTS**

### **Part 1**

The reports by the President and the Secretary General were acknowledged and approved.

## **5. UPCOMING MEASURES / DECISIONS**

### **5.1 FROM THE BOARD**

#### **5.1.1 World Cup calendar for the 2005/06 season**

The WC calendar 2005/06 (see annex 1) is unanimously agreed upon.

#### **5.1.2 World Cup planning 2006 – 2010**

The plan for the 2006 – 2010 World Cups (see annex 2) is agreed upon by a majority.

#### **5.1.3 European Cup planning 2005/06 and 2006/07**

The plan for the 2005/06 and 2006/07 European Cups (see annex 3) is unanimously approved.

#### **5.1.4 Adaptation of the Finance Plan 2005/06 and TV Bonus 2005**

The Finance Plan for 2005/06 is agreed to be amended according to annex 4. The TV Bonus 2005 is authorised for payment in correspondence with annex 5.

#### **5.1.5 Adaptation of the Rules for Travel Expenses**

The suggestion by the Vice President Finance to increase the travel expense reimbursement by € 0.50 per kilometre in art 1.3 IBU Rules for Travel Expenses is unanimously approved.

#### **5.1.6 Finance Plan 2006 – 2010**

The Vice President Finance is commissioned to draw up a proposal, on the basis of the presented first draft, for the 2006-2010 Finance Plan addressed to the 2006 Congress for the Board meeting autumn 2005.

#### **5.1.7 Development funds and budget Summer Biathlon**

The proposition of the Vice President Development based on the recommendation of the Development Committee for payment of development funds for the 2005/06 season is unanimously approved. The proposition of the Summer Biathlon Subcommittee of the Technical Committee concerning the allocation of funds for summer biathlon for the 2005/06 season is unanimously approved. The respective member federations have been informed on funds allocated to them by individual letters of the IBU Executive Director.

#### **5.1.8 Rules for Bidding Committees**

The proposition of the Vice President Information and of the Secretary General (see annex 6) is unanimously approved.

#### **5.1.9 WCH PyeongChang**

The Board acknowledges and approves of the “Memorandum of Understanding“ that was signed on June 28 2005 by the President and Vice President Finance as well as by two representatives of the Korean Biathlon Union and of proponents of the PyeongChang Organisation Committee.

#### **5.1.10 Rules for IBU Licences**

The Vice Presidents Finance and Sport are commissioned to draw up a proposal in cooperation with the Secretary General and involvement of the Technical Committee, on the basis of the presented first draft, and to present it to the Board for a decision at the autumn meeting.

#### **5.1.11 Biathlon in Asia**

The Secretary General is granted the authority to call in the Asian Coordinator to the World Championships and other important events, in order to support the active role of Biathlon in Asia.

#### **5.1.12 IBU Partner and Supplier Contracts, increase of non-cash benefits**

The proposal of the Secretary General to set up extensions of expiring partner contracts and conclusion of new partner contracts at an equivalent goods production value of 36,000 € cost price instead of the 30,000 € until now, and set up supplier contracts at 12,500 € instead of the former 10,000 €, is unanimously agreed upon. The Vice President Marketing is commissioned to investigate the issue of a pool and of an annual fee for pool members in the appropriate bodies.

#### **5.1.13 Guidelines for the Approval of Biathlon Events or Competitions according to art 1.3.1 IBU Constitution and model permit ruling for World Team Challenge at Schalke**

The suggestion of the Secretary General of an amendment of the Guidelines for the approval of biathlon events according to art 1.3.1 of the IBU Constitution (see annex 7) and the model permit ruling for the WTC at Schalke is unanimously approved.

#### **5.1.14 Charge roster for IBU representatives in 2005/06**

The IBU representatives for the 2005/06 season are assigned areas of responsibility as specified in annex 8.

#### **5.1.15 Print of the Russian version of the IBU Handbook**

The Vice President Finance is assigned the duty of having the authorised Russian version of the IBU Handbook, based on a preliminary price quote, printed under the lead management of the Secretary General, the Vice President Sport, the Russian TC member Melikhov, and compiled by Russian biathlon expert Pilberg who is in charge of the translation (Part 1: Constitution, Election Rules, Disciplinary Rules, Anti-doping Rules, Annexes to the Event and Competition Rules).

#### **5.1.16 Admittance of new members: Ireland**

The Board has decided to admit the Snowsports Association of Ireland as a provisional member. The decision will be operative from the moment the Snowsports Association of Ireland resubmits the Irish Olympic Committee's edict confirming the exclusive agency of the biathlon sport by the Snowsports Association of Ireland.

#### **5.1.17 Change of rules within the urgent competence**

The Board has finalised the following rules changes or clarifications within the scope of its urgent competence, in effect as from the 2005/06 season onwards:

### **IBU Event and Competition Rules**

#### **Arts 1.4.4 and 15.6.1**

Arts 1.4.4 and 15.6.1 remain unchanged.

#### **New formulation of art 15.6.2 of the IBU competition rules**

Art 15.6.2 shall read:

**North America:**

“ ... One male and female competitor respectively per country. The selection applies to Biathlon North America in orienting at the best three placings in the competitions in the Eastern part and of those in the Western part of the NAC Series respectively.”

**Art 2.3.1 is to have the following new sentence added at the end of the first paragraph:**

“In Youth/Junior WC and WC Mixed Relays, the Technical Delegates may also form mixed or common competition juries (e.g. Youth Men and Youth Women; Men/Youth and Junior, Women/Youth and Junior).”

**Art 3.1.6.4 I Annex A of the IBU Event and Competition Rules is to read:**

“On both sides of the fore stock, a smooth – meaning flat or nearly flat -, rectangular IBU marking surface shall be kept free of other markings and reserve ammunition, more precisely at the athlete’s discretion 15 cm in front of the trigger, the bolt handle or the front end of the trigger hole over the entire width of the stock and at least 4 cm high. Alternatively, the bolt handle or the trigger hole may reach into this area, however, only so much that the IBU rifle control sticker is not covered up or cut off.”

**Exception to Annex C of the IBU Event and Competition Rules (in effect until the 2006 Congress):**

The VP Sport shall be granted authority to act as a trainer and examiner within the TD and International Referee training in deviation from Annex C of the Event and Competition Rules, alongside the members of the TC.

**Exception to art 3.4.5 of the IBU Event and Competition Rules:**

For the Olympic Games 2006 in Torino, in deviation from art 3.4.5 of the IBU Event and Competition Rules, a numbering system on V-boards on the basis of a model by the VP Sport is permitted on the ground and in the colours red, yellow.

**IBU Anti-Doping Rules****Art 8.1 first sentence shall read:**

Blood controls are organised to detect the use of growth hormones, EPO and NESP and related substances, and to determine the haemoglobin and reticulocytes values of athletes.”

**Art 8.2.1 shall read:**

“a) Before each competition in a World Cup and a World Championship and before other competitions according to Board ruling on recommendation by the Medical Committee, at least six athletes, chosen by drawing lots, must submit themselves to a blood control. All athletes who are to be found on the official start list at the time of the draw shall be included in the draw. The lots shall have been drawn between two (2)

hours and one (1) hour fifteen (15) minutes before the start of zeroing. The draw shall be completed under the direction of the medical delegate.

b) Each organising committee shall supply six (6) doping control accompanying persons (chaperones) per event, one additional person as team leader and one replacement doping control chaperone with a car. The team leader shall be present two (2) hours before the start of zeroing at the doping control station and is to be given instructions there by the medical delegate. The six doping control chaperones are to meet at the doping control station one (1) hour and ten (10) minutes before the zeroing starts. Each doping control chaperone shall fill out the doping control form for the athlete drawn and assigned to him/her, and shall then go to the waxing cabins, in order to be present at the waxing cabin of the assigned athlete 45 minutes before the zeroing begins.

c) As long as athletes have not officially been withdrawn from the start list at the time the lots are drawn, they shall undergo the blood control. Also, all those athletes who officially withdrew after the draw are subject to the blood control, should their lot be drawn.

All athletes who are on the official start list at the time of the draw must be in their waxing cabins 45 minutes before zeroing begins. Should their lot be drawn, this will be notified to them there at this time by the chaperone. The athletes in question must then sign a declaration of notification and make their way without delay to the doping control station with their chaperone. The chaperones must remain with their athlete from this time on, the entire time until the start of their athlete's blood control. As soon as all the athletes drawn have been notified that they were drawn for blood testing, a declaration of the termination of the selection process for blood control shall be hung up in public in the waxing cabin area.

d) Athletes who are not present at their waxing cabins at the time of attempted notification of their selection must report to their chaperone within 15 minutes at the most from this moment. The athlete is counted as having been informed as soon as the notification has been given to his/her squad at the waxing cabin. With the exception of proven cases of *force majeure*, absence from the arranged blood control shall count as refusal of the doping control after art 7.8 of IBU Disciplinary Rules with the consequences being suspension after art 7.6.1 and a further control (urine control).

e) A replacement chaperone with a car must be ready at the moment of notification at the doping control station to look for athletes chosen by lot who could not be located at the waxing cabins.

f) WADA is authorised to selection of IBU athletes for its own testing as agreed upon with the IBU."

**Art 8.2.2 is to be deleted. Art 8.2.3 is to become art 8.2.2 and art 8.2.4 is to become art 8.2.3.**

The Board decides in accordance with art 8.2.1 of the IBU Anti-doping Rules that blood control tests shall only be carried out at World Cups, the World Championship Mixed Relay and at Winter Olympic Games in the 2005/06 competition season.

**Art 8.3.6:** The number “3 ml” is to be replaced with “2 x 3 ml”. The words “the last” in the same sentence are to be deleted.

**The proposal forwarded in writing** by Myriam Bedard for a regulation amendment is to be referred to the TC for conferral and preparation of a proposal at the next session.

#### **5.1.18 Member federations in the Balkans and regional cooperation**

The Board confirms unanimously that the foundation of a regional biathlon union (e.g. Balkan federation, South American biathlon union) is unallowable according to the IBU constitution. However, member federations in the Balkans are permitted and are welcome - as are those of other regions - to cooperate more closely with each other without having the form of an organisation, and also to hold common events as per IBU rules.

#### **5.1.19 WADA-cooperation agreement Out-of-Competition Tests**

The Secretary General is commissioned to inform WADA of the following changes to the draft copy of the agreement as IBU's official stance:

##### **Art 4.2:**

“WADA reserves the right to test out of competition those Athletes not in the IBU registered testing pool, who might compete, or have competed, internationally at IBU sanctioned events. Such a test may however only take place after WADA has consulted the chairman of the IBU Medical Committee.”

Aside from this, WADA shall be asked to add a ruling that the WADA controllers are to act in a sensitive manner towards the athletes while carrying out their testing.

#### **5.1.20 Approval – release from contract Ertl/ DSV – FISU**

The change of Athlete Ertl from the DSV (German Ski Federation) to the FISU (Italian Winter Sports Federation) is approved and will be legally operative from November 1 2005 or from a later date, should an application to that effect, with all the proofs required by constitutional legislation, be forwarded in due time by the FISU to the IBU headquarters.

#### **5.1.21 IBU Sponsor guide 2005/06**

In the IBU Sponsor guide 2005/06 changes according to annex 9 will be made in relation to the 2004/05 version. The Secretary General are given the task of completing the revised version, including the adapted photographs and illustrations.

#### **5.1.22 Enhancement of the IBU website**

Both of the concepts put forward by the Vice President Information on a model proposed by the IBU Direction of Communications to enhance the IBU website are essentially approved.

#### **5.1.23 Special issue of *Olympia biathlonworld***

The concept for the special issue *Olympia biathlonworld* and for the Olympic events guide presented by the Vice President Information is approved.

#### **5.1.24 IBU Golden Classic 2005/06**

The Board wishes to honour Oberhof, Ruhpolding and Antholz with the title attribute "IBU Golden Classics 2005/06" for the 2005/06 season, as long as the three organisation committees are prepared to keep up the same standards as in the 2004/05 season. The Secretary General is granted authority to negotiate the details with the representatives of the three organisation committees.

#### **5.1.25 Increase of the maximum accommodation rate at IBU World Cups and World Championships and miscellaneous IBU sports events**

The maximum rate for overnight stays in the sense of art 12.1.3 and art 15.1.3 of the IBU Event and Competition Rules remains unchanged.

#### **5.1.26 Decision of the Programme for the 2006 Youth/Junior WCH in Presque Isle (USA) and resolution on the principal basic programme for the 2007 Youth/Junior WCH in Martell (ITA)**

The programme suggested by the TC for the 2006 Youth/Junior WCH in Presque Isle (USA) ([see annex 10](#)) is unanimously approved. The programme should basically also be adequate for instrumentation at the 2007 Youth/Junior WCH in Martell (ITA) as well.

#### **5.1.27 Organisation of a OC/IR seminar in Östersund, Idre, Torsby (SWE) and of a IR seminar along with testing in Presque Isle (USA)**

The seminars proposed by the TC for July and August 2005 in the sites named above are confirmed approvingly.

#### **5.1.28 Appointment of TDs and International Referees for the 2005/06 season**

The TC's proposal concerning appointment of TDs and International Referees for the 2005/06 season ([see annex 11](#)) is unanimously approved.

#### **5.1.29 Congress 2006**

The Secretary General's report has been received approvingly, and the date for holding the congress is confirmed as August 29 – September 3, 2006 in Khanty-Mansiysk. The venue is to be the Hotel Yugorskaya Dolina. The date for the WCH Summer Biathlon in Ufa is changed accordingly to September 4-10, 2006.

#### **5.1.30 FORUM NORDICUM 2005**

The postponement of the dates of the 2005 event is received and approved. In regards to the short amount of time allotted on the programme to the IBU (18.10.2005, 15.30 –



17.00), the IBU will now only be represented by the Vice President Development and the Director of Communications.

#### **5.1.31 Extent of IBU trademark copyright protection**

The report of the Secretary General is received approvingly. The Secretary General is commissioned to add a provision concerning the reservation of the IBU's right to exercise trademark law to the events declarations. A trademark application for the IBU World Championships and the IBU World Cups, the European Championships and the European Cups will each be transacted by the IBU respectively.

#### **5.1.32 Personnel issues 2005/06 and personnel development plan 2006 – 2010**

The reports of the Secretary General and the Vice Presidents Sport and Finance on requisition of IBU functionaries for World Cups, European Cups, of the IBU member in the "EBU Quality and Supervisory Team" as well as on preliminary personnel in the IBU headquarters for the 2006-2010 period are received approvingly.

### **4.3 Board members**

The reports of the Vice President are unanimously accepted.

## **6. FROM THE IBU COMMITTEES AND PANELS**

The minutes of the Medical Committee 20/05, of the Development Committee 12/05, of the Marketing Committee 07, of the Information Committee 15 and 16, of the Technical Committee 24, of the Partner and Supplier Meeting 4 and 4 of the IT Meeting are accepted approvingly. The Secretary General is commissioned to adhere to requests and proposals addressed to the IBU headquarters recorded in the minutes as much as is possible.

In addressing the following minutes, the Board has ruled that:

### **6.1 DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 12/05**

The Development Committee is requested to look for appropriate ways to enable the Board to process applications more quickly.

### **6.2 MARKETING COMMITTEE 07/05**

With regard to the newly successful contract extension with the EBU and APF, it is agreed that the market analysis set out in point 9 of the minutes is to be regarded as a non-urgent matter at present. The posited effectuation and outsourcing of lesser business activities into a GmbH (≈ Ltd) in point 13 of the minutes are esteemed to be

not viable with regard to the extension of the non-profit status of the IBU for a further five years.

### **6.3 INFORMATION COMMITTEE 16/05**

The IBU Director of Communications is commissioned on behalf of the Secretary General to attain if possible the technical appliance, requested in point 2.9 of the minutes of the 16<sup>th</sup> session, through suppliers.

### **6.4 TECHNICAL COMMITTEE 24/05**

At point 4.5 it is confirmed that a common regulation working group, with the inclusion of Board members, will be summoned to a meeting in Bled (Slovenia) in August 2005.

The implementation of Motion 1 has already borne concrete results. Recommendation 1 has been met in Berlin at the GAISF meeting, in so far as the matters fall within the IBU's area of responsibility.

Motions 2 and 8 will be discussed and, as the case may be, ruled upon at the Board's autumn session after a precise regulation proposal has been tabled.

Bansko (BUL) is confirmed as venue for the ECH 2007 in accordance with Recommendation 2 of the TC.

## **7. NEXT MEETING AND MISCELLANEOUS**

The next Board session will take place on November 2-8 2005 in Sicily (ITA).

## **Rules for bidding committees at IBU congresses**

1. Bidding committees that apply at an IBU Congress to hold a biathlon event must take into account that the Congress has a large number of additional points of order to be raised for which discretion is required. The IBU therefore expects restraint and consideration correspondingly.

2. With regard to the number of applicants and the number of events up for tender at any given time, the maximum number of members from bidding committees who can be accredited is set at 15 persons. This figure encompasses all people, including government representatives, members of parliament, representatives of the national Olympic committee.

3. The bidding committees will be allotted a certain time from the Congress' order of the day for the presentation of their application. The presence of members of the bidding committee in the congressional meeting hall is permitted only during this time, and during the time of technical preparations, which is set in agreement with a functionary from the IBU headquarters outside of the congress sessions. Under no circumstances is it allowed for associates of bidding committees to be present during a presentation of another bidding committee in the congress hall or on the balustrade of the congress hall, or to disturb by way of noise from outside.

4. It is permitted for each bidding committee to invite the congress participants once (x 1) to a social event (lunch or dinner, concert, excursion et al.) within the duration of the Congress. The invitation must then be sent to all congress participants. Coordination of the invitation dates shall be tabled to the IBU Secretary General in advance of the Congress.

All arrangements in relation to the social events of the bidding committees are to be made by them directly with the organising committee of congresses or with equivalent institutions on site.

5. The bidding committees must hand out a copy of their presentation (video, CD or similar) together with a written version of the entire text presented, signed by the president of the bidding committee and by a fully authorised representative of the said member federation immediately at the end of the presentation to the IBU Secretary General.

Additional verbal, spoken comments made during the presentation must be expounded in writing in the copy of the presentation for the IBU.

6. The bidding committees are to uphold the greatest possible reciprocal respect. A comparison of one's own application with that of contestants or patronising remarks towards contestants is not allowed.

7. The bidding committees must take into account the fact that members of the IBU Executive Board, the IBU auditors, the chairpersons of the IBU committees and other IBU functionaries are not allowed to take sides with a bidding committee. In particular, it is not permitted for any of these persons to influence the voting decision of members of the IBU Congress at the election or to make any manner of sign or call or other method of contact towards this aim.

8. As far as the situation at a congress venue permits it, accommodating bidding committees in hotels in which members of the congress are staying is not permitted.

9. Depending on the conveniences at the congress venue, bidding committees shall be given the opportunity to present their candidacy in the form of an exhibition, by applying to the SG of the IBU. The form of the representation is left up to the bidding committees; however, the exhibition should take place in a reasonable setting and not hinder other bidding committees/exhibitors. The size and the place of each bidding committee will be set by the SG of the IBU on a fair basis.

10. In the event of IBU charter flights to congresses, bidding committees may travel on the charter flight depending on capacity, on application. If the seats applied for do not suffice, the SG of the IBU decides on the allocation of free seats to bidding committees.

11. On the day of arrival at the Congress or in due time before the beginning of the Congress, an informal shared meeting by the IBU with the aim of briefing and coordination will take place under the main leadership of the IBU SG.

**Guidelines for the approval of biathlon events or competitions in the sense of art 1.3. sentence 2 of the IBU Constitution**

1. Every event shall be considered “international” in the sense of § 1.3. sentence 2 of the IBU Constitution that is broadcast outside of the host country by electronic media (e.g. TV) and at which athletes from more than three countries participate or, if only the last condition is certain to be fulfilled, the event is likely to achieve an important broad effect. Regardless of fulfilment of the aforesaid conditions, an event shall be considered “international” and is encompassed by the permit requirement if it is organised by a private business venture aiming at profit, and is not merely advertised for athletes of the country concerned.
  
2. The event may not be temporally or spatially associated to any world cup, a world championship or a continental cup (e.g. European Cup). It shall be considered to be temporally associated if it is a period of time of two days or less before or after one of the aforementioned IBU events. It shall be considered to be spatially associated if it is the very same event venue of one of the aforementioned IBU events or a place that is connected with such a venue through the same administrative or tourist region.
  
3. A permit shall be applied for through the IBU headquarters in writing, elaborating all the details that are demanded for calls for tender of IBU world cups, a month before the application for being accepted into the IBU Biathlon Calendar, or three weeks before the start of the event at the very latest. The application has to contain in particular how many nations are to be invited and what TV stations were contacted for broadcasting or who are aiming to broadcast to the best of the organiser’s knowledge. Furthermore, the application has to include a preliminary budget and detailed specifications of planned marketing. Written proof of the permit from the national federation responsible shall be attached to this application.
  
4. The permit shall be granted in the scope of these guidelines by the IBU SG on behalf of the IBU Executive Board. Any intended deviation of a decision from these guidelines behoves the permission of the IBU Executive Board, if time does not permit, by way of circular decision.



5. In the event of a permit being granted, as far as another solution is not agreed upon with the IBU SG according to the contingencies of a specific case, 1 € per entry ticket sold for the event/competition or an equivalent amount shall be handed over to the IBU for the explicit purpose of organising the IBU Youth/Junior World Championships or, if it is more appropriate given the circumstances in the case in question, to supporting promising young athletes to the appropriate national federation. This is, depending on the contingencies of the case in question, to be included in print on the entry ticket. Furthermore, all IBU rules and miscellaneous applicable IBU resolutions (in particular those of the IBU Sponsor Guide) shall be followed, and the instructions of the Technical Delegate shall be heeded, should such a person be appointed by the IBU for that particular event. Depending on the decision in the case on question and, as far as this is considered doable for the IBU, one of the following statements or another one – subject to the particular occasion and agreement with the IBU SG – is to be added to the title of the event: “under the patronage of the IBU”, “part of the IBU Grand Prix Series”, “... an IBU Grand Prix”. The permit has to make reasonable allowance for the interests of the IBU sponsors.

6. No athlete shall be paid any wage or fee for participation, excluding travel costs and accommodation reimbursements.

7. One month at the latest after completion of an event, a written report shall be submitted to the IBU by way of the headquarters, if possible with a disclosure of the final account balance for the event. The number of entry tickets sold in particular must be seen from this, if applicable.

8. The approval shall take into account as much as possible the avoidance of possible date clashes with other similar events in other IBU member countries.

## **IBU Sponsor guide 2005/06**

### **B.5.1**

On top of the maximum two ski clips permitted, a total of two commercial trademarks (writing or logo) of the ski manufacturer or a sponsor are allowed, **whereby an agreement between the ski manufacturer and the NF/athlete is needed that permits the latter to use the trademark of a sponsor, determines an allowance for not using such a trademark or forbids the use of another trademark than that of the manufacturer. The existence of an agreement that permits the application of another trademark than that of the manufacturer is to be presented by the athlete on request at any time at the occasion of competitions.** The total surface area of the trademarks shall not exceed 50 cm<sup>2</sup> per ski clip. The trademarks on both ski clips may only be visible to the viewer from one and the same perspective. (Regarding sizes and areas, see the actual size figure on the right).

### **B.5.h. Ski suit**

The ski suit may feature commercial trademarks of the manufacturer, logos or writing of the employer (e.g. army, customs, police) or commercial trademarks/logos/writing of sponsors of the national federation. If the logo/insignia of the employer is integrated into the emblem of the athlete's national team, it does not count as a separate trademark. The total area of all the trademarks/logos/writing on the ski suit must not exceed 350 cm<sup>2</sup>. At summer Biathlon world championships, this limit applies to all items of clothing put together (including socks and stockings). Any manner of advertising is forbidden on skin.

The total area of such an individual piece of advertising may not exceed 100 cm<sup>2</sup>. Logos of one and the same sponsor as well as more than one logo from the employer or also from the manufacturer may neither be placed above nor beside each other. If additional items of clothing are worn over the ski suit (e.g. gaiters), no logos whatsoever may be applied to these. The design and the visual look of the ski suit may in no way, form or size represent or imitate the logos, fonts or products of the manufacturer of the ski suit. The placing of the pieces of advertising is at the athlete's discretion. (Concerning sizes, areas and examples of placing see the illustration on the right.)

**The common custom of manufacturer designs on clothing in a continuous form, without repetition of the designer logo, is permitted in the following places: on the ski suit on the outer seam of each sleeve (from the collar to the sleeve cuff) and on the outer seam of the upper body as well as of both legs (beginning at both shoulders to the bottom of the trouser seam). In cases in which the ski suit consists of two individual garments (upper and pants), the aforementioned applies correspondingly. The width of the design may not exceed 10 cm.**

B.5.b. Rifle

A double-sided IBU rifle control sticker (name/logo of an IBU sponsor) is compulsory on the rifle stock of all athletes **in the size of 12.5 x 3.5 cm each. This rifle control sticker is to be placed on the 15 x 4 cm large, even surface in such a way that it is not covered or cut off in any place. Three pieces of advertising may be used at a distance of at least 1 cm to this rifle control sticker area, two at a maximum of 50 cm<sup>2</sup> each and one a maximum of 25 cm<sup>2</sup> for sponsors of the national federations.** Advertising on superstructure (including the diopters at Anschütz) and on purpose-built annexes is not permitted.
